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STORY

This prompts her to reflect on the relationships she has taken for granted, but also on the relationships she is re-establishing. Bela experiences her first love and her first major life crisis. A crisis that leads her, in extreme moments, to try drugs and self-harm. In search of meaning and self-expression, Bela forms a band that represents freadom and a expression of her worldview.



DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT





JANI SEVER

Jani Sever is a director, writer and producer. He graduated in History from the Faculty of Arts in Ljubljana. In the 1980s, he was a member of Ljubljana punk bands (Cao Picke, UBR) as a drummer and lyricist. He also published poems in Glovenian literary magazines (Literatura, Problemi, Nova revija). From 1989 to 1996, he was an investigative journalist at Mladina, for which he wrote, among other things, about the post-war massacres and the illegal arms trade. From 1996 to 2006, he was editor-in-chief of Mladina. In 2006, he tounded and was editor—in—chief of the online Video portal Vest, for which he produced the documentaries Elena and Ves poet svoj dolg (You know your debt, poet), for which he also worked as a scriptwriter, and the internet fiction series Prepisani (overwritten). In 2011, he tounded the production company Sever & Sever, which has so far produced 11 short films, 12 documentaries, three feature films and two TV series. Most of the films have been awarded at film festivals.
